







Working within the Port of Leith

ACCESS / EGRESS & SECURITY:

- Leith is an ISPS Port
 - International Ship Port & Security
 - No pets allowed in port
 - No children allowed in port

A Personal Pass is required

- You will have to have a pass to enter and should have it available at all times whilst in port.
- Access and Egress by Bath Road Gate only

MOVING AROUND THE PORT:

- Operational areas should be avoided:
 - All Quaysides
 - During Lifting Ops
 - During Vessel Discharge
 - Be aware of Plant and Vehicle
 movements

General Awareness

- Stay situationally aware of different obstacles whilst in port
 - Deep Water
 - Unprotected quaysides

BRINGING VEHICLES INTO WORK:

- Personal Vehicles can be admitted to port but MUST:
 - Be road legal
 - Registered on the Port Data base
 - Display an valid car pass
 - Follow all traffic Management Arrangements
 - Speed is 20MPH
 - No overtaking
 - Obey all signs and barriers
 - Wear a seatbelt
 - Drive to conditions

Every Day The highest standards which we require you to work to should be achieved every day.

PPE Requirements





- Hard Hat (wearing chin strap)
- High Viz Clothing
- Safety footwear

Additional PPE Requirements:

- Life Jacket (within 1 mtr of any body of water or quayside).
 - 275Kn
 - Must have light
 - Must have whistle
 - **Must** be within inspection criteria.
- Work at Height:

PPE

- Harness
- Suitable lanyard
- Equipment to be within relevant inspection criteria.
- Dropped Object Aware.


Specialised PPE Requirements:

 To be assessed & put in place as part of any Risk Assessment / Method Statement Process.



Working Near Water (Life Saving Rule):

Working Near Water



 Life Jackets MUST be worn within 1 mtr of any quayside.

- ✓ Life Jackets must be:
 - 275 Kn Standard
 - ➤ Have a light fitted
 - Have a whistle fitted
- ✓ Risk Assessment and Rescue Plan should be in place before any work near water.

Working Near Water



Fire Arrangements.





- Make yourself aware of Fire arrangements including:
 - Any Planned drills
 - Muster points
 - Sign in & out Visitor Protocols
 - Ask what the Fire Alarm sounds like (Bell / Claxon etc)
 - No contractor equipment is to block any fire escape route.
 - Only smoke in Designated Areas.
 - Adequately store combustible materials including COSHH items.
 - Propane, Butane, Petrol or other highly flammable liquids or explosive substances are not to be used without permission from Forth Ports Sponsor.

Hot Work:

FIRE


- Hot Work Permit(s) must be gained before starting any planned hot work.
- All combustible materials should be removed and a safe site maintained.
- Sparks and Moulten metal should be controlled & managed
- Have a Hot Work Fire Watcher in place during and after Hot Work (details recorded on PTW)



Working At Height (Life Saving Rule):

Working at Height





Accompanied by a Rescue Plan

- Only to be carried out by competent persons
- All equipment to be verified as within inspection dates.
- Work in MEWPs Need to hook on!
- Prevent Dropped Objects & have sufficient Barriers in place below and tie off tools.

Control of Work (Life Saving Rule):

Control of Work



 ✓ Full Risk Assessment & Method Statement should be provided for all planned work.

- All energy sources are to be identified and controlled
- All work requiring a Permit to Work is to be applied for in advance
- All isolations / de-isolations are to be applied for in advance
- All applications through your port sponsor
- Dynamic Risk Assessment to be carried out before starting work

Incidents & Accident Reporting



- Accidents can happen, if you have an accident or incident on any part of the port estate YOU MUST:
 - Report all details to your Forth Ports Sponsor / Ships Agent / Supervisor as soon as possible.
 - All damages must be made safe and reported (as above) asap
 - You may be asked to take a statement or undertake a D&A Test.


- ✓ Emergency Number is **999**

Drug & Alcohol Policy






- ✓ No alcohol or drugs are to be consumed <u>before or during</u> any visit to Forth Ports property.
- ✓ ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY!
- ✓ Drug & Alcohol Testing is possible for all persons entering onto site.
- ✓ D&A Testing after any incident
- Declare all prescription drugs if completing any work on Forth Ports property.

Security (ISPS)




ISPS

- Port comes under International Ship & Port Security protocols meaning:
 - All persons (and there belongings) entering port are liable to search
 - Valid security passes must be displayed at all times
 - CCTV Images are being recorded for security reasons
 - No Pets, animals or children allowed in port.



Security (ISPS)



ISPS

- ✓ If You see something suspicious
 - Be alert to suspicious activity
 - Report any suspicious activity immediately to your
 Supervisor, Manager or
 Security
 - You should not get involved just report!
 - > In an emergency dial **999**

The easiest and most efficient way to report a safety observation is using the AssureGoApp on a mobile electronic device e.g. mobile smartphone or tablet.

This provides the ability for all employees to report Safety Observations on the App using a mobile device through the scanning of a QR Code.

 All employees must ensure they only use a mobile device when it is safe to do so and in accordance with relevant company policies e.g. Data Protection, Driving for Work, Mobile telephone / device / radio /audio equipment, Social Media, Whistleblowing etc.
